 - (4) 2 Photographs taken within the past six months (Please attach the photos to the application form and also send the digital files separately to usa@midwest.edu.)

1. COMPLETING THE APPLICATION FORM

Please complete the application form. This will not only provide the Admissions Committee with important information about you as a prospective student, but will also demonstrate your writing ability. Return your completed application with the fee and two passport-sized photos.

2. NOTIFICATION REGARDING ACCEPTANCE

Midwest University will accept your application at any time. As soon as your application is complete, your file will be submitted to the Admissions Committee for review, and you will subsequently be notified of its decision.

3. REFERENCES

Midwest University requires a reference from a former professor for each program. (Midwest University requires two references for Ph.D. program.)

4. APPLICATION ESSAY

The Writing ability of the applicant will be assessed through this essay. The essay should be 500-700 words (Bachelor), 750-900 words (Master), and 1,000-1,200 words (Doctor).

5. HOUSING

Housing applications will be mailed to all interested applicants, and housing assignments will be made based on the availability of housing units.

6. ESL WAIVER INFORMATION FOR INTERNATIONAL **STUDENTS**

If you are applying for an undergraduate program at Midwest University, you may be exempted from taking ESL (English as a Second Language) courses if you meet the required level of English proficiency.

To request an ESL exemption, you must submit an official score report from one or more of the approved English proficiency tests listed below.

* Minimum Scores for ESL Waiver:

iBT 68, PBT 520, CBT 190, IELTS 6.0, TOEIC 690

All submitted scores will be evaluated according to the university's guidelines. If the score meets the required standard, the ESL course requirement may be waived.

- 6. The case for leaving or dropping out of Midwest University after submitting the application form;
 - 1 The Application Fee (\$100) is NON-REFUNDABLE.
 - ② Tuition fees will be refunded, according to the catalog refund policy listed below:

- * 15 week program up to 1 week: 90%, 3 weeks: 70%, 5 weeks: 50%, 7 weeks: 30%; After 7 weeks will not be refunded in full * 8 week program: 1 week: 90%, 2 weeks: 70%, 3 weeks: 50%, 4 weeks: 30%; There is no full refund after 4 weeks (Refund Processing Fee: \$ 30.00).
- 7. To be eligible for a scholarship, students must complete a minimum number of credits each semester: at least 12 credits for undergraduate students, 9 credits for master's students, and 8 credits for doctoral students. All academic programs must be completed within the designated time frame, and students must earn a grade of B or higher in each course to maintain their scholarship eligibility. If a student discontinues their studies during the academic term, their scholarship eligibility will be automatically revoked.

- 8. When I send tuition and other fees to Midwest University, I have a responsibility to pay all extra fees (i.e., processing fee, transfer fee, etc.)
- 9. Those who are expected to graduate for their degree must attend the graduation ceremony at Midwest University in the US and complete the required credits. If they don't attend the graduation ceremony, their graduation will be postponed to a later date. And all graduates are required to pay graduation fees.
- 10. Student Regulations for those who major in Music (Graduation Recital Fee and Assessment Fee)
 - * All prospective graduates are required to have a graduation recital according to the school regulations.
 - * I am responsible for scheduling the recital or concert program after discussing with my advisor. Also, I will pay a fee to rent the venue.
 - * Graduation Recital Fee: The prospective graduates' performance will be evaluated by the two professors. All prospective graduates should pay the evaluation fee and processing fee (\$500). Also, all prospective graduates need to pay the transportation fee for the two professors, respectively.
